EXECUTIVE SUMMARY	<p>At the last Primary Care Committee the Head of Primary Care reported that the anticipated investment to enable the set-up of an infrastructure had been delayed until the next financial year.</p> <p>Health Education England has recently confirmed that a sum of £500k will be allocated to support the delivery of the training for primary care.</p> <p>There have been discussions within the Joint Executive to discuss the early changes to support the training hub. It has been agreed in principle that the contract for the current employee will remain employed by Shrewsbury and Telford NHST (SaTH), but will be hosted within the primary care team with colleagues in Shropshire CCG.</p> <p>Resources will be received and managed by SaTH with the transfer of budget to the relevant CCG.</p> <p>The hub manager, head of primary care and assistant finance manager have worked through a process that ensures effective oversight of this resource, ensuring tight governance that is in line with Standing Financial Instructions.</p> <p>It is anticipated that upon receipt of resources, the joint group will work to ensure the allocation to deliver both joint, and CCG</p>

	specific priorities.
FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:	The CCG currently has a budget of £42k for the delivery of training requirements of Telford and Wrekin.
